TITLE III/Senior Community Services Recreation/Intergenerational Programming  
Updated: August 4, 2023

**Description:**

Activities that promote socialization between older adults and children under the age of 18, including educational, athletic, performing arts, and artistic programs.

**Client Eligibility:**

- Age Requirement: Clients must be aged 60 or older.
- Residency: Clients must be residents of the county covered by the Title III Older Americans Act program.

**Examples of Tasks:**

- Organizing and facilitating recreational activities and events that promote intergenerational interactions.
- Planning and implementing outings, trips, and group activities.
- Arranging and conducting workshops, classes, or presentations related to recreational and intergenerational themes.
- Providing opportunities for older adults to engage in physical exercise, games, crafts, and hobbies.
- Promoting socialization and fostering meaningful relationships between older adults and younger generations.
- Collaborating with community organizations, schools, and youth programs to create intergenerational partnerships.

**Provider Requirements:**

- Demonstrated expertise and experience in recreational programming and intergenerational activities.
- Knowledge of the needs and interests of older adults.
- Ability to create inclusive and engaging environments for intergenerational interactions.
- Trained staff capable of organizing and facilitating recreational activities.
- Collaboration with local schools, youth organizations, and community partners.

**Supervision Requirements:**

- Adequate supervision of recreational activities to ensure participant safety and well-being.
- Staff trained in first aid and emergency response protocols.
- Regular monitoring and evaluation of the program's effectiveness.
- Periodic assessment of client satisfaction and feedback.

**Documentation Requirements:**

- Maintain accurate records of client enrollment, attendance, and participation.
- Document any significant interactions, achievements, or challenges experienced by participants.
- Record evaluations and feedback from participants and their families.
- Providers are required to submit regular reports to COAAA via WellSky data collection software.

**Units of Service:**

- One unit of service is defined as one participant's engagement in one recreational program or event.
