 fields including, but not limited to nursing, gerontology, social work, or
 psychology. They are able to address a broad range of issues related to the
 well-being of their client. They often have knowledge about the costs, quality,
 and availability of resources in their communities.

 - o Organizing, sorting and downsizing
 - Customized floor plans
 - Arranging for the profitable disposal of unwanted items through auction, estate sale, buy-out, consignment, donation, or a combination of the above
 - Interviewing, scheduling, and overseeing movers
 - Unpacking and setting up the new home

Nesterly Central Ohio

- Started in 2019, this program is housed at the Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging and is a collaboration with Age Friendly Columbus.
- Nesterly is an online platform which matches hosts (homeowners who have a room to rent) and guests for a homesharing arrangement of at least 1 month or longer.
- Nesterly offers a platform which background checks both parties, helps to negotiate a lease, and arranges for automated payments.
- Allows both parties to customize what an ideal homeshare arrangement looks like for each person and allows for a task exchange for a simple reduction in rent.

ASSISTANCE/ADVISORS FOR THOSE SEEKING LONG-TERM CARE PLACEMENT

A group of companies and advisors who assist families in locating options when a person is seeking long term care placement. These services are generally at no cost to an individual or a family since the facilities pay the advisors a fee for successful placement. These advisors will locate options for individuals, accompany people on a visit, assist to negotiate placement and often assist with the actual move. They generally assist individuals who will be *paying privately* for assisted living, intermediate, or skilled nursing home placement.

PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZERS AND PRODUCTIVITY CONSULTANTS

- People who work in this field are very diverse; however, they generally charge an hourly fee
 and are insured. The national association's website is www.napo.net and the state
 association is www.napo-ohio.com. If there is a CPO beside the organizer's name, it means
 they have undergone a certification process with this organization.
- There is another organization that specializes in more serious types of organizing challenges. It is called *Institute for Challenging Disorganization (ICD)*. Its website is www.challengingdisorganization.org. The website has very helpful information to assist those struggling with organizing their spaces as well as lists of professionals who can help those struggling with hoarding and collecting disorders.
- There may be others working in this field who are not members of these professional organizations. The COAAA is only able to list those who are members of the above mentioned professional organizations. If you are hiring a person/company not on this list, ask about their credentials, insurance to be in your home, and written policies about handling your possessions. Anytime you hire any professionals, you should ask to see written confirmation of these issues.
- Among the types of activities that a professional organizer can do for someone is:
 - O Hands-on organizing—one organizer or an entire organizing team can come to a home (or office) to organize the space and then advise a person on the best organizing tools and tactics for their specific challenges. They can also help people make decisions about what to keep, how to handle donations, recycling, and trash removal. The time investment can be anywhere from a few hours to many weeks, depending on the size of the space, the amount of clutter, and the person's ability to make decisions.
 - Home maintenance—organizers can help create better organizing systems for relatively organized homes. Home maintenance could include an annual clean-out of the kitchen pantry or help with redesigning the home's garage and storage areas. Organizers can communicate a person's needs with the rest of the household to streamline communication and reduce friction.
 - Moving, relocating, and downsizing—Some professional organizers specialize in moves and relocations. They'll help to manage everything from interviewing moving companies to packing, unpacking, and organizing all of the household belongings.

ESTATE SALE & AUCTION COMPANIES

- These are companies that will sell items from the home. Some companies
 will price and auction individual items; some companies will arrange an
 estate sale at the home. Some companies specialize in particular items or
 geographic areas.
- To find a company, check with one of the professionals listed on previous pages or read online reviews carefully and talk to a few companies before proceeding.
- Most companies will charge a set percentage (ex: 20%-40%) for each sale.
 The percentage does vary by location, and the type of items being sold.
 Common tasks of a company are:
 - Sift through all the items in the home, including closets, garages, attic, and cabinets to ensure all salable items are accounted for.
 - Organize and stage each item and piece of furniture in the home in order to make them more desirable.
 - Research and price each item at the highest value possible.
 - Photograph and market the sale online.
 - Staff the sale with individuals on the days of the sale.
